



Substance Use Reality Check

Some ways of using substances are safer than others.

Many teens **try** alcohol and drugs but do not use substances frequently.

- ✓ **7 in 10** high school students have **tried alcohol**
- ✓ **1 in 5** high school students have used prescription drugs **without a doctor's prescription**



Substance use can have a negative impact.

- ✓ **Alcohol** is a common **weapon** used by perpetrators of sexual violence, and is connected to **2 in 3 sexual assaults** among adolescents
- ✓ **Anxious and depressed** teens are **twice** as likely as their peers to try **marijuana** by age 16

Safety is most important.

The connection between **choices** and **consequences** can be impaired under the influence of drugs and alcohol.

- ✓ **22%** of sexually active high school students reported using **alcohol or drugs** during their most recent sexual encounter
- ✓ Nearly **1 in 4** youth report having had sex **without a condom** because they were drinking alcohol or using drugs

Youth should feel comfortable asking questions **without fear of judgment or punishment**. Addiction is **not a choice**, and could be a sign of mental illness, trauma, or other life stressors.

ASK. Be clear that your intention is to help, not police youth.
